### **PRIVATE STUDY SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION 2010-2011**

All Charlotte Symphony Youth Orchestra (CSYO) and Junior Youth Orchestra (JYO) musicians are required to take private lessons. Each year, The Symphony Guild of Charlotte, Inc. provides need-based private study grants to eligible CSYO musicians. The Charlotte Symphony Youth Orchestra Parent's Association will provide scholarships to JYO members. The scholarships may cover part or all of a season's worth of lessons. The scholarship application process takes place in September (October for JYO); recipients are notified by mail or e-mail usually within a month of the application deadline.

#### **JYO Scholarships:**

Up to five need-based private study scholarships are awarded.

Assumes a 30-45 minute lesson length.

Each scholarship covers up to \$20 per lesson for 20 required lessons per year, (10 lessons each semester).

#### **CSYO Scholarships:**

Up to fourteen need-based private study scholarships are awarded.

Assumes 45-60 minute lesson length.

Each scholarship covers up to \$20 per lesson for 24 required lessons per year (12 lessons each semester).

#### **Scholar Responsibilities:**

- Scholars and teachers must complete and return information forms by the deadline indicated on the forms before payment can be made.
- Scholars must study with a Charlotte Symphony Orchestra musician or extra.
- Scholars must complete the number of lessons outlined above and show satisfactory progress. Each lesson must take place on a separate occasion.
- All scholars are expected to maintain faithful attendance at orchestra rehearsals, exhibit exemplary behavior and musician improvement, and serve as positive role models to other orchestra members. The Guild encourages scholars to volunteer for such Guild activities as the Designer House, Lollipops, and Musical Petting Zoo.

At the end of the first semester, the conductor, the teacher, and the Guild Scholarship Committee review each scholar's record to determine whether the scholarship should be renewed for the second semester.
